




### **Demographics for the 2022-2023 School Year**




#### **Enrollment by Grade and Gender**

## **A Catholic Liberal Arts Education**

At the heart of a successful school is an intellectually challenging and wellconstructed liberal arts curriculum designed to "free" students from the bonds of ignorance, vice, and wiles of the world. ("Liberal" is from the Latin *liberare*, meaning "to free.") At Angelus Academy, we draw upon the Catholic, classical tradition for our liberal arts curriculum, which focuses on integrated content, skill development, and pedagogy in support of our mission of intellectual and spiritual formation.

We aim to free our students...

- ...from ignorance and relativism, as we teach them to seek the **truth** in religion, math, science, history, and literature, and as we lead them to the Truth.
- ...from sin and moral relativism, as we provide them with examples of **goodness** and virtue, inspired by the lives of the saints, heroes, and heroines in history and literature, and embodied in the Good Shepherd and His teachings.
- ...from secular materialism and worldly distractions, as we immerse students in the **beauty** of nature, art, architecture, music, poetry, literature, and math, and draw their gaze toward God.

## What's New at Angelus Academy: REFURBISHING AND ENHANCING OUR OUTDOOR SPACE

With gratitude to the **WEISS FAMILY** for spearheading this special project, our exterior statue of the Blessed Mother was repainted and given a new location—with its own designated walkway and bench near our flag poles. What a blessing it is to have Our Lady grace the frontentrance area of our school building!

Longtime science teacher MRS. SUSAN HUNT and our Middle School students have created and planted several gardens on the school grounds—one in the front of the school building and another alongside the upper parking lot. In science, our sixth graders learn about different types of plants as part of their naturestudies curriculum. They are primarily responsible for planting and taking care of the school gardens (although interested seventh and eighth graders are also welcome to help with the gardens' maintenance). In its inaugural year, our students successfully grew a variety of fruits and vegetables such as strawberries, tomatoes, broccoli, kale, romaine, beets, hot peppers, and pumpkins as well as basil, cilantro, garlic, rosemary, and zinnias. Building on the students' enthusiasm, Mrs. Hunt shared that plans are in the works to build an additional garden alongside the upper parking lot. We thank Mr. Joe Ammirati for constructing the first set of garden boxes and the school families who helped pull weeds and pick crops during the summer months!
